The original A and B classes were completed with 4.7" low angle guns and a 3" or 2 pounder AA guns. Two sets of quadruple 21" torpedoes rounded out a useful armament. During the late 1930's depth charges and ASDIC detection equipment was added to the armament to increase the anti-submarine warfare capabilities.
