In addition to the widespread use of complementary and alternative therapies by the public, other reasons for pursuing the issue in nursing education include: media attention to the positive outcomes of CAT, nursing interest and the increasing number of articles on the topic in highly respected professional journals, the inclusion of these therapies in medical curricula, the necessity to provide culturally congruent care, and increasing governmental legitimacy (Reed, Pettigrew, & King, 2000).

Complementary and Alternative Therapies in Nursing ...

More patients are turning to complementary therapies or alternative medicine (CAM) but recent news reports in NT have highlighted that this remains a difficult area of practice (Nursing Times, 2005a). It is therefore essential to understand the principles and applications behind these therapies. It is also important to look at why patients may favour them and to understand the ethical issues of efficacy, training, competence and patient safety.

The use of complementary therapy in nursing practice ...

Nurses are involved with ongoing clinical trials using integrative therapies and data analysis to provide evidence for integrating complementary/alternative therapies into clinical practice. The impact of integrative therapies has been documented to provide immediate and beneficial effects on pain among hospitalized patients.

Integrating Complementary Therapies Into Nursing Practice ...

Alternative therapies are sometimes grouped with complementary therapies, but they refer to different concepts. Alternative therapies are used in place of conventional medicines or treatments. There is evidence to support the use of some complementary therapies, but alternative therapies are typically unproven or have been shown to be ineffective.

If a non-mainstream practice is used together with conventional medicine, it's considered "complementary." If a non-mainstream practice is used in place of conventional medicine, it's considered "alternative." Most people who use non-mainstream approaches also use conventional health care.
