Practice routine cleaning of frequently touched surfaces. More frequent cleaning and disinfection may be required based on level of use.

Chemical cleaning processes provide a cleaning method for the whole SG, i.e., ranging from tubsheet to top of bundle. Have a safety plan in place for protecting staff who use cleaning chemicals. Provide appropriate protective gear for cleaning staff.
