Not surprisingly, the metal content of the coin impacts its value. Generally, gold Roman coins are worth more than their weight in gold. For instance, a 4.5 gram Honorius coin can fetch around \$700 to \$800.

Unlike most modern coins, Roman coins had (at least in the early centuries) significant intrinsic value. However, while the gold and silver issues contained precious metals, the value of a coin could be slightly higher than its precious metal content, so they were not, strictly speaking, equivalent to bullion. Also, over the course of time the purity and weight of the silver coins were reduced.
