Originally performed in 458 BC, Agamemnon is the first play in Aeschylus' Oresteia trilogy, which also includes Libation Bearers and Eumenides. The play is set in front of the palace of Argos and begins with a Watcher noticing a beacon fire which signals the return of Argos' king, Agamemnon, ten years after sailing away to conquer Troy.

Aeschylus and the Agamemnon are not easy reads: he uses a large vocabulary including words that are only used once in the text (thanks to Raeburn and Oliver I now know the meaning of "hapax!"). Agamemnon is characterized by long speeches by the main actors with shorter choral odes between.
